


REPAIRS TO I-895 ENTRANCE AND EXIT RAMP FOR POTEE STREET/PATAPSCO AVENUE

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

- ▶ Repairs to I-895 Potee Street and Patapsco Avenue entrance and exit ramps as part of the MD Transportation Authority's (MDTA) deck replacement project for I-895 bridges over Patapsco Avenue, Potee Street and Hanover Street. Northbound and southbound I-895 lanes will be reduced to 10.5-foot (left lane) and 11.5-foot (right lane).

▶ **WORK ZONE:**

- I-895 bridges over Patapsco Avenue, Potee Street and Hanover Street.
- I-895 Potee Street and Patapsco Avenue entrance and exit ramps (Exit 7).

▶ **WORK INCLUDES:**

- Replacing bridge decks.
- Painting and repairing sub- and superstructures.
- Milling and overlaying roadways.
- Drainage improvements.

▶ **WHAT DRIVERS CAN EXPECT:**

- Entrance ramps from Potee Street and Patapsco Avenue to northbound I-895 closed on or about April 5, 2013 until July 7, 2013. Detours will direct drivers to I-895 via Frankfurst Avenue.
- Southbound I-895 Exit 7 (Potee Street) ramp to be closed on or about July 7, 2013 until October 2013. Detour will direct drivers to Exit 3 (I-695), to Exit 10 (Washington Boulevard), to Patapsco Avenue.
- Deck replacement work to be done during off-peak travel times.



SAFETY TIPS:

- **Expect the Unexpected** – Be aware of reduced speeds and changing traffic patterns.
- **Stay Alert for Construction Workers and Equipment** – Keep a safe distance.
- **Devote Your Full Attention to Driving** – It is illegal to use handheld devices while driving.
