



New Traffic Patterns, Closures and Detours for Curtis Creek Drawbridge Repairs

I-695 INNER LOOP Closure and Two-Way Traffic on OUTER LOOP Beginning on or About Feb. 27

In order for crews to remove and reset barrier walls and implement new traffic patterns necessary for repairs to the drawbridge-lifting mechanisms, the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) will implement the following closures and detours. **NOTE:** Dates and times are approximate and contingent upon weather conditions, work progress and traffic volumes.

- **Sunday, Feb. 21, through Friday, Feb. 26, from approximately 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.** the following morning, the ramp from MD 10 to the OUTER LOOP and the OUTER LOOP of I-695 will be closed. **DETOUR:** MD 10 to northbound MD 710 (East Ordnance Road), right onto southbound Pennington Avenue, continue on Hawkins Point Road (MD 173), right onto northbound Fort Armistead Road, to the OUTER LOOP of I-695.
- **Sunday, Feb. 21, beginning at 9 a.m., and continuing until approximately March 28,** the left lane of the OUTER LOOP drawbridge will be closed to OUTER LOOP traffic between MD 10 and Quarantine Road.
- **By 7 a.m. Saturday, Feb. 27,** the INNER LOOP drawbridge will be closed and **two-way traffic** – one lane of traffic in each direction, separated by barrier walls – will be in effect on the OUTER LOOP of I-695. This traffic pattern is expected to be in effect until approximately March 28.

Additional ramp closures and detours will be temporary and limited to overnight hours.

No over-sized loads will be permitted on I-695 between Quarantine Road and MD 10. Speed limits are reduced from 55 mph to 45 mph during the project. Motorists should anticipate delays, especially during peak-traffic periods. For destinations north or south of Baltimore, motorists are urged to use I-95 or I-895 in lieu of I-695/Key Bridge.
