





NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY ACT (NEPA)

The National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) outlines the process and procedures Federal agencies must follow: to analyze the potential environmental consequences of their proposal, to document the analysis, and to make this information available to the public for comment prior to implementation. NEPA applies to any Federal action, including Federal approval of a permit or Federal funding.

What is an Environmental Assessment (EA)?

An EA is the type of NEPA documentation prepared when the project is not expected to have a significant effect on the environment.

The EA contains data and analyses to demonstrate the lead agency has considered potential environmental impacts.
